Your Life's In Danger

Numerous complaints to the BUZZER office about carelessness and recklessness on the Lake brought us to Captain L. G. Moses of the Greenwood Lake Marine Police. The Captain informed us that these complaints were justified, and during his 39 years at the Lake, he has never seen so many accidents or near drownings in any one season.

As recently as last Saturday, Captain Moses while on patrol, noticed a boat sinking off Chapel Island, and calling out instructions over his megaphone, rescued the five persons that were in the boat. This makes a total of 102 persons that he has rescued in these waters. The captain also has personally recovered 9 bodies by grappling.

The work of the Marine Police is performed by public-spirited citizens without any cost to the community, and is a most valuable service indeed. They have many problems confronting them, and beautiful Greenwood Lake being as large as it is, makes it impossible for them to cover it all at the same time. Therefore, it is expected that our resident citizens will co-operate to the end that their problems will be confined to week-end visitors, who may not be familiar with our marine laws.

Captain Moses emphasized the fact that the Marine Police are fully qualified police officers and have the backing of the Village, State and Federal Laws. In conclusion, Captain Moses said "Let's all be good neighbors and avoid the necessity of our just being 'cops' — although we will if we have to."

To which I know we will all say "We're with you 100%."

Water Ski Warnings

(1) To watch skiers, stop your boat and drift in the vicinity where they are riding. NEVER FOLLOW A SKIER. They have been known to fall at the most unexpected moments. They usually don't know they are being followed and may cut right in front of you and fall.

(2) When you see a skier in the water, steer clear of the back of the tow boat which is circling back to get him. The rope hangs 75 feet back of the boat.

(3) Use a rear-view mirror when driving a ski boat. Keep looking ahead while driving and occasionally check on the skier in the mirror. The big danger of water skiing is not for the skier but for the innocent "by-swimmer."

(4) Always stop the motor when a skier is climbing into the boat. It's so easy to slip your feet right under the boat, if you should lose your grip while climbing in.

(5) Ski drivers must keep away from the shore, swimmers and other boats. Come near the dock only to pick up or drop off a skier.

Speedboat Safety

(1) Never sit on the side of a boat while it is moving. Reason: If a driver makes a sudden turn, as he might do to avoid a piece of driftwood, a person on the edge is likely to fall to the outside of the turn due to centrifugal force. Because the stern of the boat is being driven to the outside of the turn by the rudder or outboard motor, the person is almost certain to be run over by the back part of the boat and slashed by the propeller. This is a most frequent cause of serious injury in motor boats.

(2) Always open motor hatches for half a minute before starting engine after gassing up an inboard motor boat. Reason: Any spilled gasoline tends to form explosive mixtures in the closed-up parts of the boat. Sparks from the starter, relay and armature are just right for setting off a lethal explosion. With hatches open, air will tend to dilute the fumes below the explosive mixtures. Gasoline spillage is easily detected by the smell and even if the mixture does ignite, the flame shoots straight out of the engine hatch and usually does not result in any damage. Fires after gassing up are the Number One cause of complete destruction of speedboats, according to insurance companies.

(3) Don't speed close to and parallel to the shore. Reason: Swimmers and small children in boats, and most floating debris are in the 100-foot strip next to shore. The wash and swells from the bigger boats can easily capsize the smaller craft. Also, your wake and noise are a nuisance to those enjoying the lakefront. For enjoying the view of the shore at close range, it is much better to cruise along at 600 to 700 RPM.

(4) If you should happen to go boating at night, be sure that your boat is adequately lighted, so that you may easily be seen by other boats at a reasonable distance.

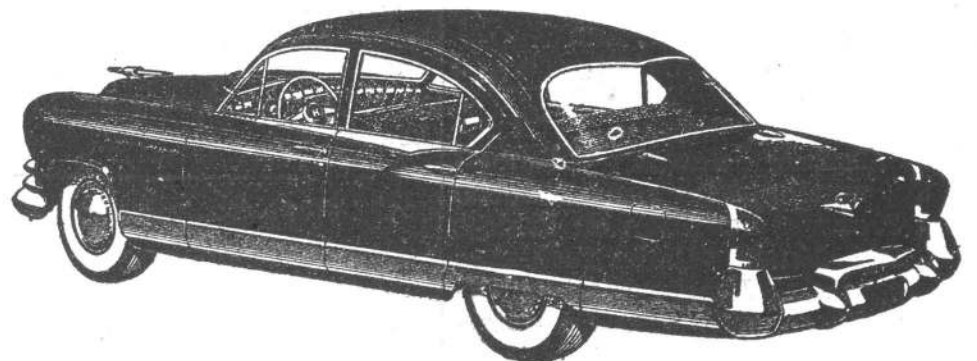

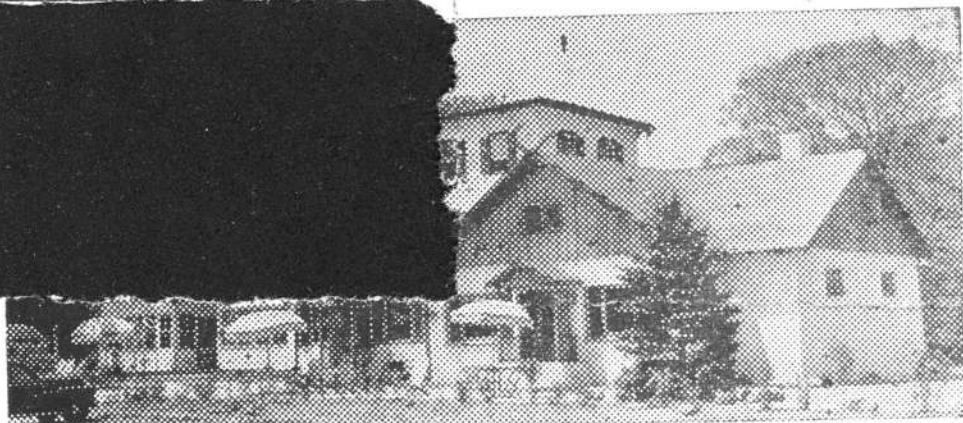
